

If either party is unable to perform or suffers delay in performance, due to any cause beyond its reasonable control (regardless of whether the cause was foreseeable), including without inhibition acts of God, inclement or unusually severe weather conditions, strikes, labor shortage or disturbance, incacident, war or civil disturbance, delays of caniers, cyber-attacks, terrorist attacks, failure of normal sources of supply, or acts or inaction of government, the time of performance will be extended by a period equal to the length of time it talks to overcome the effect of the event, in actition, Stemens shall be entitled to be compensated by Buyer for reasonable and direct additional costs incurred during such event. Stemens will notify Buyer within a reasonable time after becoming aware of any such event, if there are force majeure delays exceeding 100 days in the aggregate, Stemens may terminate the Agreement. For the avoidance of doubt, failure to pay shall not constitute a force majeure delay.
- 6. BUYER'S REQUIREMENTS. Slemons' porformance is contingent upon Buyer timely complying with and fulfilling all of its obligations under this Agreement. These obligations include the Buyer supplying all necessary across to Equipment, where applicable, and all required "Third Party Parts' [parts, components, equipment or materials provided by Stemens and subsequently repaired, serviced or charufactured or supplied by Stemens or which were originally supplied by Stemens and subsequently repaired, serviced or otherwise altered by any party not affiliated with Stemens, occurrents, permits and approvate needed for Stemens to perform including, but not limited to, accurate technical information and date, drawing and document approvals, and all necessary commercial documentation. Buyer shall provide access to the Site as reasonably required by Stemens for the performance of the Services. Stemens may request a change order for an equitable equipment in prices and times for performance, as well as a calculate for any delay resulting from the failure of Buyer's contractors, successors or assigns to most these obligations or any other obligations in this Agreement.

Buyer shall also meintain the Site in a safe condition, notify Siemens promptly of any site conditions requiring special care, and provide Siemens with any available documents describing the quantity, return, location and extent of such conditions, including any Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) related to all hazardous materials at the Site which may impact the Services.

7. INDEMNITY. Slemens and Buyer (each as an "Indemnitor") shall indemnity, hold hamtless and defend the other ("Indemnitee") from and against all third party claims alleging bodily injury, death or damage to a third party's tangible property, but only to the extent caused by the indemnitor or its autocurractor's negligent acts or omissions. If the injury or damage is caused by the penties' joint or contributory negligence, the loss and/or expenses shall be borne by each party in proportion to its degree of negligence. No part of Buyer's Site or property of Buyer (or Site Owner) is considered third early proporty.

Indemnitee shall provide the Indemnitor with prompt written notice of any third party claims covered by this Anido. Indemnitor has the unrestricted right to select and hire counsel, and the exclusive right to conduct the legal defense and/or settle the daim on the Indemnitee's behalf. Indemnitee shall not make any eximision(s) which might be prejudical to Indemnitor and shall not enter into a settlement without the express permission of Indemnitor.

- a. WARRANTY. (a) Signess warrants that it will perform the Services in a professional and workmantike manner. If the Services fall to meet the warranty standards set torth in this Antide 8(a) within the Warranty Period delined in the attached Addandum A, and Buyer promptly reports such non-conformance to Stemens during the above mentioned Warranty Period, Stemens shall at its own expense re-perform the relevant Services or, in Stemens' sole discretion, refund Buyer the pro-rate portion of the fees paid to Stemens under this Agreement allocable to the nonconforming Sorvices (the "Warranty").
- (b) Concitions to the Warranties. The Warranties are conditioned on: (i) no repairs, modifications or alterations being made to the Equipment' other than by Siemens or its authorized representatives; (ii) Buyer handling, using, storing, installing, operating and maintaining the Equipment in compliance with any parameters or instructions in any specifications attached to or incorporated into this Agreement, (iii) or in the absence of such conditions, parameters or instructions or to the extent not applicable, in accordance with the generally accepted insuring translates applicable in the locate where the Services are being performed and having regard to the nature of the Services; (iv) Buyer discontinuing

use of the Equipment after it has, or should have had knowledge of any defect in the Equipment; (v) Buyer providing Siemens with reasonable access to operating and maintenance data as requested by Siemens, (which may include secure broadband connection). Without expense to Siemens, Buyer shall provide to Siemens and Siemens' subcontractors and their respective employees and agents on a twortly four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week basis, access to the Site, and each unit, including rights of way and easements required for safe access of such personal and equipment, as well as, to the octoral applicable, orline access to the Site, including to an installed emorate mentioning system and to all units, as necessary to permit Siemens to perform the Services.; (vi) Equipment not having been subjected to accident (including force majoure), alternation, abuse or misuse; and (vii) Buyer not being in default of any payment obligation. Buyer shall provide, without cost to Siemens, access to the necessary to permit Siemens to perform its warranty obligations.

- (c) Exclusions from Warranty Coverage. The Warranties do not apply to any Third Party Parts or Equipment or to services not performed by Sidmens pursuant to this Agracment. Siemens will have no liability to Buyer under any legal theory for such Third Party Parts, Equipment, services or any related assignment of warranties.
- (d) Warranty Notice. Buyer must provide written notice of any claims for breach of Warranty within the applicable Warranty Period. Additionally, absent written notice within the Warranty Period, any use of the Equipment after expiration of the Warranty Period is conclusive evidence that the Warranties have been satisfied.
- (e) Remedies. Buyer's sole and exclusive remedies for breach of the Warranties are limited, at Sicmers' discretion, to re-performance of the non-conforming portion of the Services, within a reasonable time period, or refund of all or part of the purchase price. The warranty or re-performed Services is limited to the remainder of the original Warranty Period. Unless Sigmens agrees otherwise in writing, Buyer will be respectable for any costs associated with: (i) transportation to and from the Siemens factory or repair facility; and (ii) damage to Equipment components or parts resulting in whole or in part from non-compliance by the Buyer with Article 8(b) or from their deteriorated condition.

(I) THE WARRANTIES IN THIS ARTICLE 8 ARE SIEMENS' SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES AND ARE SUBJECT TO THE LIMITS OF LIABILITY IN ARTICLE 9 BELOW. SIEMENS MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, COURSE OF DEALING AND USAGE OF TRADE.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING IN THIS AGREEMENT TO THE CONTRARY, SIEMENS IS NOT LIABLE, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, WARRANTY, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE). STRICT LIABILITY, INDEMNITY OR ANY OTHER LEGAL OR FOUTABLE THEORY, FOR: LOSS OF USE, REVENUE, SAVINGS, PROFIT, INTEREST, GOODWILL OR OPPORTUNITY, LOSS OF PRODUCTION, COSTS OF CAPITAL COSTS OF REPLACEMENT OR SUBSTITUTE USE OR PERFORMANCE, LOSS OF INFORMATION AND DATA, LOSS OF POWER, VOLTAGE IRREGULARITIES OR FREQUENCY FLUCTUATION, CLAIMS ARISING FROM BUYER'S THIRD PARTY CONTRACTS, OR FOR ANY TYPE OF INDIRECT, SPECIAL, LIQUIDATED, PUNITIVE, EXEMPLARY, COLLATERAL, INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OR FOR ANY OTHER LOSS OR COST OF A SIMILAR TYPE.

SIEMENS' MAXIMUM LIABILITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT UNDER ANY THEORY OF RECOVERY, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, IN TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE AND STRICT LIABILITY), UNDER WARRANTY, INDEAMITY OR OTHERWISE, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE TOTAL PRICE PAID TO SIEMENS UNDER THIS AGREFUENT.

BUYER AGREES THAT THE EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS IN THIS ARTICLE 9 WILL PREVAIL OVER ANY CONFLICTING TERMS AND CONDITIONS IN THIS AGREEMENT AND MUST BE GIVEN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT WHETHER OR NOT ANY OR ALL SUCH REMEDIES ARE DETERMENTED TO HAVE FAILED OF THEIR ESSENTIAL PURPOSE. THESE LIMITATIONS OF LUBILITY ARE EFFECTIVE EVEN IF SIEMENS HAS BEEN ADVISED BY BUYER OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. THE WAIVERS AND DISCLAIMERS OF LIABILITY, RELEASES FROM LIABILITY AND LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY EXPRESSED IN THIS ARTICLE 9 EXTEND TO SIEMENS SUBCONTRACTORS, AGENTS AND SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS OF SIEMENS.

FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBT, IN THE EVENT THAT PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE TO THE BUYER'S PROPERTY RESULTS FROM THE FAILURE OF A PORTION OF THE SERVICES TO CONFORM TO ITS RESPECTIVE WARRANTY DURING THE APPLICABLE WARRANTY PERIOD SIEMENS 'LIABILITY SHALL IN NO CASE EXCEED SIEMENS' OBLIGATION TO PERFORM THE REMEDIES SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE 8, AS APPLICABLE, WHICH SIEMENS WOULD HAVE HAD TO PERFORM IF SUCH REMEDY HAD BEEN CARRIED OUT IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE CCCURRENCE OF THE PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE.

#### 10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.

Siemens will, at its own option and expense, defend or settle any suit or proceeding brought against Buyer based on an allegation that any processes performed by Siemens in connection with the Services constitutes an infringement of any Patent Cooperation Treaty (FCCT) country member's patent or misappropriation of a third party's trace secret or copyright in the country where the Buyer's Site to located. Buyer will promptly give Siemens written notice the suit or proceeding and the authority, information, and assistance needed to defend the claims. Siemens shall have full and exclusive authority to defend and settle such claim and will pay the damages and costs awarded against Siemens in any suit or proceeding so defended a Siemens and shall not enter into a settlement without Siemens' consent. If and to the extent any process performed by Siemens in connection with the Services as a result of any suit or proceeding so defended is held to constitute infringence or its use by Buyer is sejoned, Siemens will, at its option and expense, either: (i) procure for Buyer the right to continue using seld process; (ii) replace it with substantially equivalent non-infringing process; or (ii) modify the process so it's use is non-infringing.

Siemens will have no duty or obligation under this Article 10 if the process is: (i) performed according to Buyer's design or instructions and compliance therewith has caused Siemens to deviate from its normal course of performance; (ii) modified by Buyer or its contractors with devices, methods, systems or processes not furnished hereunder and by reason of said deviers, instruction, medification, or combination a suit is brought against Buyer. In addition, if by reason of such design, instruction, medification or combination, a suit or proceeding is brought against Siemens, Buyer must protect Siemens in the same manner and to the same extent that Siemens has agreed to protect Buyer under this Article 10.

THIS ARTICLE IO IS AN EXCLUSIVE STATEMENT OF SIEMENS' DUTIES AND BUYER'S REMEDIES RELATING TO PATENTS, TRADE SECRETS AND COPYRIGHTS, AND DIRECT OR CONTRIBUTORY INFRINGEMENT THEREOF.

#### 11. CONFIDENTIALITY.

(a) Both during and after the term of this Agreement, the parties will freat as confidential all information obtained from the disclosing parry and all information compiled or generated by the disclosing parry under this Agreement for the receiving parry, including but not limited to business information, the question, the Agreement, processes and procedures, known, mothods and techniques employed by Siemens in connection with the Services, technical data, drawings, flow charts, program listings, software code, and other software, plans and projections. Neither parry without advance wither parry manner that identifies the other parry without advance wither permission. Except for security curveillance, the observing or recording of the Services or any part thereof, whether by cholographic, vidoo or audio devices or in any other manner is prohibited. In the severt any such prohibited observation or recording occurs, Siemens may (in addition to any other legal or equitable injuris and remodities but plants of siemens has satisfied itself that the prohibited conduct has caused, and in such oven (a) the date of delivery or time for enformance will be extended by a particle of time which Siemens determines necessary and (b) Buyer will reimburse. Siemens for Siemens' and its Suppliers' additional costs and expenses resulting from such delay, including but not limited to any for demobilization or remobilization. Unless required by appropriate governmental authorities, neither party shall, without the prior written cancent of the other party, issue any public statement, press reliates publicity hand-out or other material relating to the Services performed on Buyer's Sto or Equipment. However, Siemens has the right to share confidentially obligations set forth harrein.

(b) Nothing in this Agreement requires a party to treat as confidential any information which: (i) is or becomes generally known to the public, without the fault of the receiving party; (i) is disclosed to the receiving party; without obligation of

confidentiality, by a third party having the right to make such disclosure; (ii) was previously known to the receiving party, without obligation of confidentiality, which fact can be demonstrated by means of documents which are in the possession of the receiving party upon the date of this Agreement; or (iv) was independently developed by receiving party or its representatives, as evidenced by written records, without the use of discloser's confidential information, or (iv) is required to be disclosed by law, except to the extent eligible for special treatment under an appropriate protective order, provided that the party required to disclose by law will promptly advise the originating party of any requirement to make such disclosure to allow the originating party the opportunity to obtain a protective order and exist the originaling party in so colons.

(c) It is Siemens' policy not to unlawfully or improperty receive or use confidential information, including trade secrets, belonging to others. This policy procludes Siemens from obtaining, directly or indirectly from any employee, contractor, or other individual rendering services to Siemens conflicintal information of a prior employer, client or any other person which such employee, correction, or individual is under an obligation not to declose. Buyer agrees to abide by this policy.

(d) Siomens shall retain all intellectual property rights in the Services, works, Siemens' documents, processes, Siemens' confidential information, and any dosign information and/or documents made by (or on behalf of) Siemens. Upon receipt of all foos, expertes and taxes due in respect of the relevant Services, Siemens grants to the Buyer a non-transferable, non-exclusive, royally-free license to copy, use and communicate Siemens' documents for the sole purpose of operation and maintenance of the facility upon which the Services have been performed.

- COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. The parties agree to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.
- 13. CHANGES IN SERVICES. No change will be made to the ecope of Services unless Buyer and Sigmons agree in writing to the change and any resulting price, schedule or other contractual modifications. If any change to any law, rule, regulation, order, code, standard or requirement impacts Sigmons' obligations or performance under this Agreement, Sigmons shall be entitled to a change order for an equitable adjustment in the price and time of performance.
- 14. NON-WAIVER. Any waiver by a party of strict compliance with this Agreement must be in writing, and any failure by the parties to require strict compliance in one instance will not waive its right to insist on strict compliance thereafter.
- 15. MODIFICATION OF TERMS. These terms may only be modified by a written instrument signed by authorized
- 16. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party may assign all or part of this Agreement, or any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other, but either party may assign its rights and obligations, without recours or consent to, any partynt, wholly owned subsidiary or affiliate or affiliate's successor organization, restructuring or salt of substantially all of a party's assets). However, Buyer shall not assign this Agreement to a competitor of Siemens; an entity in litigation with Siemens; or an entity backing the financial capability to satisfy Buyer's obligations. Any assignes expressly assumes the performance of any obligation assigned. Siemens may grant a security Interest in this Agreement and/or assign proceeds of this Agreement Without Buyer's consent.
- 17. APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION. This Agreement is are governed by and construct in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware, without regard to its centific of laws principles. The application of the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sole of Goods is excluded. BOTH SIEMENS AND BUYER KNOWINGLY, VCLUNTARILY AND IRREVOCABLY WAVE ALL RIGHTS TO A JURY TRIAL IN ANY ACTION OR PROCEEDING RELATED IN ANY WAY TO THIS AGREEMENT. Each party agrees that claims and disputes arising out of this Agreement must be decided exclusively in a federal or state court of competent jurisdiction located in a state in which either Buyer or Stemens maintains its principal place of business. Each party submits to the personal jurisdiction of such courts for the purpose of Bigating any claims or deputes.
- 18. SEVERABILITY, if any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, litegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired. A court may mostly the invalid, litegal or unenforceable provision to reflect, as closely as possible, the parties' original intent.
- 19. EXPORT.IMPORT COMPLIANCE. Buyer adinoxidedes that Stemens is required to comply with applicable export/import laws and regulations retaining to the sale, export, import, transfer, assignment, disposal and use of poods or information provided in the performance of the Services, including any export/import lames requirements. Buyer agrees that such goods or information shell not at any time directly or indirectly be used, exported, imported, sold, transferred, assigned or otherwise discosed of in a manner which will result in non-compliance with any export/import laws and regulations at all times.

 NUCLEAR. In the event the Services provided under the Agreement are to be performed at or in any manner in correction with a nuclear installation, the following conditions shall apply:

#### A Payer's Insurance

(1) If Buyor procures properly damage insurance applicable to occurrences at the Site and third party con-nuclear liability insurance, or either of such types of insurance, such insurance will name Sigmens and its subcontractors as additional insureds.

(2) Buyer shall have at its own cost, prior to the arrival of nuclear fuel at the Site, secured and shall thereafter maintain in force protection against liability arising out of or resulting from a Nuclear Incident (as defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended) as required by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission; provided, however, that if the nuclear fability protection system in effect on the date of the Agreement expires or is repeated, however, that if the author liability neutrons which will not result in a material impairment of the protection afforded Stemens and author liability insurance which will not result in a material impairment of the protection afforded Stemens and is subcontractors by such nuclear liability protection system which is in effect as of the date of the Agreement, taking into account the diveliability of incurrence, customary practice in the industry for plents of similar size and charactor, and other relazions in light of them existing conditions. In any event, the protection provided pursuant to this Article shall remain in effect until the decormissioning of the nuclear plant.

9. Waivers by Buyer. Neither Sigmens, nor its subcontractors shall be liable for any less of, damage to, or loss of use of property or equipment wherever located, arising out of or resulting from a "Nuclear Incident." Buyer waives and will require its insurers to waive all rights of receivery against Sigmens and its subcontractors on account of any such loss, damage, or loss of use. All such waivers shall be full and unrestricted and in a form acceptable to Sigmens.

In the event Buyer recovers camages from a third party based on losses at the Site resulting from the hazardous properties of source, special nuclear or byproduct material (as defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended), Buyer shall defend, indernify and held Simmens and its subconfractors harmless against claims by such third party which are based on Buyer's recovery of such damages. In addition, Buyer wakers and will require its insurers to wake all rights of recovery against Siemens and its subconfractors, for any and all costs or expenses arising out of or in connection with the investigation and settlement of daims or the defense of suits for damage resulting from the nuclear energy hazard.

- C. Third Party Property Protection: Buyer will indemnify and hold Stemens and its subcontractors harmless for any liability arising out of loss of or damage to property at the Site which arises out of a Nuclear Incident. In addition, Buyer shall obtain for the benefit of Stemens and its subcontractors, protection against liability for, sisting out of, or resulting from damage to any property or equipment located at the Site which its used or intended for use by Buyer in connection with the operation of the nuclear power plant (including but not limited to fuel) and which is owned by parties other than Buyer.
- D. Decontemination: Buyer shall, without cost to Stamens, perform any required decontamination and health chysics necessary for, related to or resulting from Stemans performance of its contractual obligations. This includes but is not timiled to decontamination of any Stemans equipment or tools used in the performance thereof. Buyer shall provide documentation demonstrating that components or parts being returned to Stemans after such decontamination most the requirements designated for unrestricted release as set forth in the United States Code of Federal Regulations, Title 10 Page 20.
- 21. SURVIVAL. The Articles entitled "Intelectual Property," "Limitation of Liability," "Indemnity", "Conlidentiality," "Fisk of Loss and Schedule," "Export/Import Compliance," and "Nuclear" survive any termination, expiration or cancellation of this Agreement.
- 22. SITE SAFETY, Buyer shall comply with all federal, state, and local safety regulations and standards applicable to the Site and to the Equipment on which Stemors will perform the Services. Semens shall not be obligated to commonce or perform Services unless Buyer's Site complex with all applicable safety requirements. In the event Buyer's Site safety is non-compliant, Stemens may suspend the Services unit such time as Buyer corrects the non-compliance. To the outest Stemens incurs additional time and expense as the result of Buyer's non-compliance, Stemens shall be children to expense as the result of Buyer's non-compliance. Stemens shall be children to expense and other affected provisions of the Agreement.
- 23. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE. To the extent that the performance of Services at the Site may involve the generation of hazardous waste as such term is defined in the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. 6901, et sec.), the laws of the state in which the Site is located and the rules or regulations issued thereunder as are now in effect or hereafter amended from time to time (such generated hazardous waste being herein referred to as "Hazardous Waste") shall epoly.

Buyer shall at its expense and in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances (i) furnish Siemens with containers for Hazandous Waste, (ii) designate a storage area at the Siste proximate to the Services where such containers are to be placed; and (iii) handle, store and dispose of Hazandous Waste. Buyer shall relimbures Siemens for additional costs, if any, incurred in complying with any such laws, regulations, rules and/or

Stemens shall have no responsibility or flability with regard to any Hazardous Waste which it does not know or have reason to know will be generated or released in the performance of the Services, and Buyer shall indemrify and hold Stemens harmless for all damages, losses, costs, liabilities, fines and penalties, (including recordable attornoys' fees) related to pollution and environmental impalment arising from the Buyer's property, the Equipment or the Services.

#### 24. ASBESTOS

The terms "Asbestos" and "Presumed Asbestos Containing Material" shall have the meanings on forth in United States Code of Federal Regulations Chapter 29 Section GFR 1926.1101 at soc., and "ACM" shall mean Asbestos and Asbestos containing materials.

- (1) The Buyer warrants and represents that, in any areas which may be accessed by Siemens or its Suppliers, any ACM which is or is contained in thermal insulation or sprayed-on surfacing material is conspicuously and specifically marked as ACM, and any other ACM is in a lawful condition.
- (2) Prior to Slemens' commencement of Services at any Site:
- (a) The Buyer shall, at Buyer's expense remove all thorntal insulation, sprayed-on surfacing material, and/or Presumed Asbostos Containing Material (any or all of the foregoing horeinafter "PACN"), and ACM which may be disturbed during or removal of which is required for the performance of the Services; and.
- (b) The Buyer shall ensure that any areas where any activities involving the abatement or removal of PACM or ACM shall be conspicuously identified, posted and isolated, all as required by applicable law.

BUYER EXPRESSLY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT, IN PERFORMING THE SERVICES AND DISPATCHING EMPLOYEES TO WORK AREAS, SIEMENS IS RELYING UPON THE AGREEMENTS, WARRANTIES, AND REPRESENTATIONS MADE BY BUYER IN THIS ARTICLE 24. Without imiting its other rights and ramadies, Stemens (i) shall not be obligated to commence, and may stop any affected Sarvices, unless and until it is fully explained that the Buyer is in compliance with this Article 24, and (i) shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment in the schedule, price and other provisions of the Agreement resulting from Buyer's non-compliance.

- (3) In no event shall Siemens be obligated to install, disturb, handle, or remove any PACM.
- (4) Siemens makes no representation that it is licensed to abate ACM.

(5) Buyer shall detend, indemnity and hold Siemens harmiess against any and all claims, demands, damages, losses, itabilities, fines, penalties, costs or expenses, including without limitation any dean up or remodal measures arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the Buyer's failure to comply with the provisions of this Addet 24.

#### 25. THIRD PARTY PARTS

Siemens and Buyer (each as an "Indemnitor") shall indemnity, hold harmless and defend the other ("indemnitee") from and against all third party claims alleging bodily injury, death or damage to a third party tangible property, but only to the extent caused by the Indemnitor or its subcontractor's negligent acts or omissions. If the injury or damage is caused by the parties' joint or contributory negligence, the loss and/or expenses shall be borne by each party in proportion to its degree of negligence. No part of Buyer's Site or property of Buyer (or Site Owner) is considered third party property.

Indemnites shall provide the Indemnitor with prompt written notice of any third party claims covered by this Article. Indemnitor has the unrestricted right to select and hire coursel, and the exclusive right to conduct the legal defense and/or settle the claim on the Indemnites's behalf. Indemnites shall not make any admission(s) which might be prejudicial to Indemnitor and shall not enter into a settlement without the express permission of Indemnitor.

- 8. WARRANTY. (a) Siemens warrants that it will perform the Services in a professional and workmanilise manner. If the Services fail to meet the warranty standards set forth in this Article 8(a) within the Warranty Period defined in the attached Addendum A and Buyer promptly reports such non-conformance to Siemens during the above mentioned Warranty Period, Siemens shall at its own expense re-perform the relevant Services or, in Siemens' solo discretion, refund Buyer the pro rate portion of the fees peld to Siemens under this Agreement allocable to the nonconforming Services (the Warranty).
- (b) Conditions to the Warrantles. The Warrantles are conditioned on: (i) no repairs, modifications or alterations being made to the Equipment' other than by Slemens or its authorized representatives; (ii) Buyer handling, using, storing, installing, operating and maintaining the Equipment in compliance with any parameters or instructions in any specifications attached to, or incorporated into this Agreement, (iii) or in the absence of such conditions, parameters or instructions or to the extent not applicable, in accordance with the generally accepted industry standards applicable in the locale where the Services are being performed and having regard to the nature of the Services; (iv) Buyer discontinuing

use of the Equipment after it has, or should have had knowledge of any defect in the Equipment; (v) Buyer providing Siemens with reasonable access to operating and maintenance data as requested by Siemens, (which may include accure broadband connection). Without expense to Siemens appropriate to Siemens and Siemens subcontractors and their respective employees and agents on a twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week basis, access to the Site, and each unit, including rights of way and easements required for safe access of such persons and equipment, as well as, to the extent applicable, online access to the Site, including to an installed remote monitaring system and to all units, as necessary to permit Siemens to perform the Services; (vi) Equipment not having been subjected to accident (including force majeure), alteration, abuse or missus; and (vii) Buyer not being in default of any payment obligation. Buyer shall provide, without cost to Siemens, access to the nonconformity by disassembling, removing, replacing and reinstalling any Equipment, materials or structures to the extent necessary to permit Siemens to perform its warranty obligations.

- (c) Exclusions from Warranty Coverage. The Warrantles do not apply to any Trird Party Parts or Equipment or to services not performed by Siemens pursuant to this Agreement. Siemens will have no liability to Buyer under any legal theory for such Third Party Parts, Equipment, services or any related assignment of warranties.
- (d) Warranty Notice. Buyer must provide written notice of any claims for breach of Warranty within the applicable Warranty Period. Additionally, absent written notice within the Warranty Period, any use of the Equipment after expiration of the Warranty Period is conclusive evidence that the Warranties have been satisfied.
- (e) Remodes. Buyer's sole and exclusive remedies for breach of the Warranties are limited, at Siemens' discretion, to re-performance of the non-conforming portion of the Services, within a reasonable time period, or refund of all or part of the purchase price. The warranty on re-performed Services is limited to the remainder of the original Warranty Period. Unless Siemens agrees otherwise in writing. Buyer will be responsible for any costs associated with: (i) transportation to and from the Siemens factory or repair facility; and (ii) damage to Equipment components or parts resulting in whole or in part from non-compliance by the Buyer with Article 8(b) or from their deteriorated condition.
- (I) THE WARRANTIES IN THIS ARTICLE 8 ARE SIEMENS' SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES AND ARE SUBJECT TO THE LIMITS OF LIABILITY IN ARTICLE 9 BELOW. SIEMENS MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, COURSE OF DEALING AND USAGE OF TRADE.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING IN THIS AGREEMENT TO THE CONTRARY, SIEMENS IS NOT LIABILE, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, WARRANTY, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), STRICT LIABILITY, INDEMNITY OR ANY OTHER LEGAL OR EQUITABLE THEORY, FOR: LOSS OF USE, REVENUE, SAVINGS, PROFIT, INTEREST, GOODVILL OR OPPORTUNITY, LOSS OF PRODUCTION, COSTS OF CAPITAL, COSTS OF REPLACEMENT OR SUBSTITUTE USE OR PERFORMANCE, LOSS OF INFORMATION AND DATA, LOSS OF POWER, VOLTAGE IRREGULARITIES OR FREQUENCY FLUCTUATION, CLAIMS ARISING FROM BUYER'S THIRD PARTY CONTRACTS, OR FOR ANY TYPE OF INDIRECT, SPECIAL, LIQUIDATED, PUNITIVE, EXEMPLARY, COLLATERAL, INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OR FOR ANY OTHER LOSS OR COST OF A SIMILAR TYPE.

SIEMENS' MAXIMUM LIABILITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT UNDER ANY THEORY OF RECOVERY, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, IN TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE AND STRICT LIABILITY), UNDER WARRANTY, INDEMNITY OR OTHERWISE, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE TOTAL PRICE PAID TO SIEMENS UNDER THIS AGREFMENT.

BUYER AGREES THAT THE EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS IN THIS ARTICLE 9 WILL PREVAIL OVER ANY CONFLICTING TERMS AND CONDITIONS IN THIS AGREEMENT AND MUST BE GIVEN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT WHETHER OR NOT ANY OR ALL SUCH REMEDIES ARE DETERMINED TO HAVE FAILED OF THEIR ESSENTIAL PURPOSE. THESE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY ARE EFFECTIVE EVEN IF SIEMENS HAS BEEN ADVISED BY BUYER OF THE POSSIBLITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. THE WAIVERS AND DISCLAIMERS OF LIABILITY, RELEASES FROM LIABILITY AND LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY EXPRESSED IN THIS ARTICLE 9 EXTEND TO SIEMENS.

AFFLIATES, PARTNERS, PRINCIPALS, SHAREHOLDERS, DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, SUBCONTRACTORS, AGENTS AND SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS OF SIEMENS.

FOR THE AVCIDANCE OF DOUBT, IN THE EVENT THAT PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE TO THE BUYER'S PROPERTY RESULTS FROM THE FAILURE OF A PORTION OF THE SERVICES TO CONFORM TO ITS RESPECTIVE WARRANTY DURING THE APPLICABLE WARRANTY PERIOD SIEMENS LIABILITY SHALL IN NO CASE EXCEED SIEMENS 'OBLIGATION TO PERFORM THE REMEDIES SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE 8, AS APPLICABLE, WHICH SIEMENS WOULD HAVE HAD TO PERFORM IF SUCH REMEDY HAD BEEN CARRIED OUT IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE OCCURRENCE OF THE PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE.

#### 10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Stemens will, at its own option and expense, defend or settle any suit or proceeding brought against Buyer based on an allegation that any processes performed by Stemens in connection with the Sovices constitutes an intringement of any Patent Cooperation Treaty ("PCT") country member's patent or misappropriation of a third party's trade secret or copyright in the country where the Buyer's Site is located. Buyer will promptly give Stemens written notice of the suit or proceeding and the authority, Information, and assistance needed to defend the claims. Stemens shall have full and exclusive authority to defend and settle such claim and will pay the damages and costs awarded against Stemens in any suit or proceeding so defended. Buyer shall not make any admission(s) which might be prejudicial to Stemens and shall not enter into a settlement without Stemens' consent. If and to the extent any process performed by Stemens in connection with the Services as a result of any suit or proceeding so defended is held to constitute infringement or its use by Buyer is enjoined, Stemens will, at its option and expense, either: (i) procurs for Buyer the right to continue using said process; (ii) replace it with substantially equivalent non-intringing process; or (iii) modify the process so it's use is non-infringing.

Slemens will have no duty or obligation under this Article 10 if the process is: (i) performed according to Buyer's design or instructions and compliance therewith has caused Slemens to deviate from its normal course of performance; (ii) modified by Buyer or its contractors with devices, methods, systems or processes not furnished hereunder and by reason of said design, instruction, modification, or combination a suit is brought against Buyer. In addition, if by reason of such design, instruction, modification or combination, a suit or proceeding is brought against Slemens. Buyer must protect Slemens in the same manner and to the same extent that Slemens has agreed to protect Buyer under this Article 10.

THIS ARTICLE 10 IS AN EXCLUSIVE STATEMENT OF SIEMENS' DUTIES AND BUYER'S REMEDIES RELATING TO PATENTS, TRADE SECRETS AND COPYRIGHTS, AND DIRECT OR CONTRIBUTORY INFRINGEMENT THEREOF.

#### 11. CONFIDENTIALITY.

(a) Soth during and after the term of this Agreement, the parties will treat as confidential all information obtained from the disclosing party and all information compiled or generated by the disclosing party under this Agreement for the receiving party, including but not limited to business information, the quotation, the Agreement, processes and procedures, know, methods and techniques employed by Stemens in connection with the Services, technical data, drawings, flow charts, program listings, software code, and other software, plans and projections. Neither party without advance written permission. Except for security surveillance, the observing or recording of the Services or any part thereof, whether by photographic, video or audio devices or in any other manner its prohibited. In the event any such prohibited observation or recording occurs, Stemens may (in addition to any other legal or equitable injust and remedies) stop the Services until Stemens has satisfied itself that the prohibited conduct has coased, and in such event (a) the date of delivery or time for performance will be extended by a period of time which Stemers determines necessary and (b) Buyer will reinhurse Stemens for Stemens and its Suppliers' additional costs and expenses resulting from such delay, including but not furtiled to any for demobilization or remobilization. Unless required by appropriate governmental authorities, neither party shall, without the prior written consent of the other party, issue any public statement, press release, publicity hand-out or other material relating to the Services performed on Buyer's Ste or Equipment. However, Stemens has the right to share confidential information with its affiliate and subcontractors provided those recipients are subject to the same confidentially obligations set forth herein.

(b) Nothing in this Agreement requires a party to treat as confidential any information which: (i) is or becomes generally known to the public, without the fault of the receiving party; (i) is disclosed to the receiving party, without obligation of

confidentiality, by a third party having the right to make such disclosure; (iii) was previously known to the receiving party, without obligation of confidentiality, which fact can be demonstrated by means of documents which are in the possession of the receiving party upon the date of this Agreement; or (iv) was Independently developed by receiving party or its representatives, as evidenced by written records, without the use of discloser's confidential information, or (v) is required to be disclosed by law, except to the extent eligible for special treatment under an appropriate protective order, provided that the party required to disclose by law will premptly actives the originating party of any returnement to make such disclosure to allow the originating party of any returnement to make such disclosure to allow the originating party the opportunity to obtain a protective order and assist the originating party in so retire.

- (c) It is Siemens' policy not to unlawfully or improperly receive or use confidential information, including trade secrets, belonging to others. This policy precludes Stemens from obtaining, directly or indirectly from any omployee, contractor, or other individual rendering services to Siemens confidential information of a prior employer, client or any other person which such employee, contractor, or individual is under an obligation not to disclose. Buyer agrees to abide by this policy.
- (d) Siemens shall rotain all intellectual property rights in the Services, works, Siemens' documents, processes, Siemens' confidential information, and any design information and/or documents made by (or on behalf of) Siemens. Upon receipt of all fees, expenses and taxes due in respect of the relevant Services, Siemens grants to the Buyer a non-transferable, non-exclusive, royally-free license to copy, use and communicate Siemens' documents for the sole purpose of operation and maintenance of the facility upon which the Services have been performed.
- COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. The parties agree to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.
- 13. CHANGES IN SERVICES. No change will be made to the scope of Services unless Buyer and Stemens agree in writing to the change and any resulting price, schedule or other contractual modifications. If any change to any law, rule, regulation, order, code, standard or requirement impacts Stemens' obligations or performance under this Agreement, Stemens shall be entitled to a change order for an equitable adjustment in the price and time of performance.
- 14. NON-WAIVER. Any waiver by a party of strict compliance with this Agreement must be in writing, and any tailure by the parties to require strict compliance in one instance will not waive its right to insist on strict compliance thereafter.
- MODIFICATION OF TERMS. These terms may only be modified by a written instrument signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 16. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party may assign all or part of this Agreement, or any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other; but either party may assign its rights and obligations, without recourse or consent to, any parent, wholly owned subsidiary or affiliate or affiliate's successor organization (whether as a result of reorganization, restructuring or sale of substantially all of a party's assets). However, Buyer shall not assign this Agreement to a competitor of Siemens; an entity in Itigation with Siemens; or an entity lacking the financial capability to salisfy Buyer's obligations. Any assignee expressly assumes the performance of any obligation assigned. Siemens may grant a security interest in this Agreement and/or assign proceeds of this Agreement without Buyer's consent.
- 17. APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION. This Agreement is are governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware, without regard to its conflict of laws principles. The application of the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods is excluded. BOTH SIEMENS AND BUYER KNOWINGLY, VOLLINTARILY AND INFER KNOWINGLY, VOLLINTARILY AND INFER KNOWINGLY, VOLLINTARILY AND INFER KNOWINGLY. FEATHER THE ACTION OF PROCEEDING FELATED IN ANY WAY TO THIS AGREEMENT. Each party agrees that claims and disputes arising out of this Agreement must be decided exclusively in a federal or state court of computent jurisdiction located in a state in which offither Buyer or Semens maritans its principal place of business. Each party submits to the personal jurisdiction of such courts for the purpose of Bügeting any claims or disputes.
- 18. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agraement is held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired. A court may modify the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision to reflect, as closely as possible, the parties' original intent.
- 19. EXPORTAMPORT COMPLIANCE. Buyer acknowledges that Slemens is required to comply with applicable export/import laws and segulations relating to the sale, export, import, imparier, assignment, disposal and use of goods information provided in the performance of the Services, including any export/import license requirements. Buyer egrees that such goods or information shall not at any time directly or indirectly be used, exported, imported, sold, transferred, assigned or otherwise disposed of in a manner which will result in non-compliance with any export/import laws and regulations Stemens' continuing parformance hereunder is conditioned on compliance with such export/import laws and regulations at all times.
- NUCLEAR. In the event the Services provided under the Agreement are to be performed at or in any manner in connection with a nuclear installation, the following conditions shall apply:
  - A. Buver's Insurance
- (1) If Buyer procures properly damage insurance applicable to occurrences at the Site and third party non-nuclear liability insurance, or either of such types of insurance, such insurance will name Stemens and its subcontractors as additional insureds.
- (2) Buyer shall have at its own cost, prior to the arrival of nuclear fuel at the Site, secured and shall thereafter meintain in force protection against fability arising out of or resulting from a Nuclear Incident (as defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as premedded) as required by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission; provided, however, that if the nuclear fability protection system in effect on the date of the Agreement expires or is repealed, changed, or mosfled, Buyer will, without cost to Siemens, maintain fability protection through government indemnity, limitation of flability, and/or liability insurance which will not result in a material imperiment of the protection attordad Siemens and its subcontractors by such nuclear liability protection system which is in offect as of the date of the Agreement, taking into account the availability of insurance, outstmary practice in the industry for plants of similar size and character, and other relevant factors in light of them esting conditions, in any event, the protection provided pursuant to this Article shall remain in effect until the decommissioning of the nuclear plant.
- B. Waivers by Buyer. Neither Siemens, nor its subcontractors shall be fable for any loss of, damage to, or loss of use of property or equipment wherever located, arising out of or resulting from a "Nuclear Incident," Buyer waives and will require its Insurers to waive all rights of recovery against Siemens and its subcontractors on account of any such loss, damage, or loss of use. All such waivers shall be full and unsestricted and in a form acceptable to Siemens.
- In the event Buyer recovers damages from a third party based on losses at the Site resulting from the hazardous proportice of source, special nuclear or byproduct material (so defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended). Buyer shall defend, indemnify and hold Stemens and its subcontraction harmless against claims by such third party which are based on Buyer's recovery of such damages. In addition, Buyer walves and will require its insurers to walve all rights of recovery against Sciences and its allevance and its subcontractors, for any end all coats or expenses arising out of or in connection with the investigation and settlement of claims or the defense of suits for damage resulting from the nuclear energy hazard.
- C. Trird Party Property Protection: Buyer will indemnify and hold Stemens and its subcontractors harmless for any liability arising out of loss of or damage to property at the Site which arises out of a Nuclear Incident. In addition, Buyer shall obtain for the benefit of Stemens and its subcontractors, protection against liability for, arising out of, or resulting from damage to any property or equipment located at the Site which is used or intended for use by Buyer in connection with the operation of the nuclear power plant (including but not limited to fuel) and which is owned by parties other than Proper.

- D. Decontamination: Buyer shall, without cost to Stemens, perform any required decontamination and health physics necessary for, related to or resulting from Stemens performance of its contractual obligations. This includes but is not limited to decentamination of any Stemens equipment or tools used in the performance thereof. Buyer shall provide documentation demonstrating that components or parts being returned to Stemens after such decontamination meet the requirements designated for unrestricted release as set forth in the United States Code of Federal Regulations, Title 10 Part 20.
- 21. SURVIVAL The Articles entitled "Intellectual Property," "Limitation of Liability," "Indemnity", "Confidentiality," "Rick of Loss and Schodulo," "Export/Import Compliance," and "Nuclear" survive any termination, expiration or cancellation of this Agreement.
- 22. SITE SAFETY. Buyer shall comply with all federal, state, and local safety regulations and standards applicable to the Site and to the Equipment on which Siemens will perform the Services. Siemens shall not be obligated to commence or perform Services unless Buyer's Site comples with all applicable safety requirements. In the event Buyer's Site safety is non-complant, Siemens may suspend the Services until such time as Buyer corrects the non-complance. To the extent Siemens incurs additional time and expense as the result of Buyer's non-complance, Siemens shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment in the schedule, price and other affected provisions of the Agreement.
- 23. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE. To the extent that the performance of Services at the Site may involve the generation of hazardous waste as such term is defined in the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. 6901, et seq.), the laws of the state in which the Site is located and the rules or regulations issued thereunder as are now in effect or hereafter amended from time to time (such generated hazardous waste being herein referred to as "Hazardous Waste") stell abody.

Buyer shall at its expense and in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances (i) furnish Siemens with containers for Hazardous Waste, (ii) designate a storage area at the Site proximate to the Services where such containers are to be placed; and (iii) hardle, store and dispose of Hazardous Waste Buyer shall reimburso Siemens for additional costs, if any, incurred in complying with any such laws, regulations, rules and/or ordinances.

Siemens shall have no responsibility or liebility with regard to any Hazardous Waste which it does not know or have reason to know will be generated or released in the performance of the Services, and Buyer shall indemnify and hold Siemens harmless for all damages, losses, costs, liabilities, fines and penalties, (including reasonable attorneys' lees) related to pollution and environmental impairment arising from the Buyer's property, the Equipment or the Services.

#### 24. ASBESTOS

The terms "Asbestos" and "Presumed Asbestos Containing Material" shall have the meanings set forth in United States Code of Federal Regulations Chapter 29 Section CFR 1926.1101 et seq., and "ACM" shall mean Asbestos and Asbestos containing materials.

- (1) The Buyer warrants and represents that, in any areas which may be accessed by Siemens or its Suppliers, any ACM which is or is contained in thermal insulation or sprayed-on surfacing material is conspicuously and specifically marked as ACM, and any other ACM is in a lawfut condition.
- (2) Prior to Siemens' commencement of Services at any Site:
- (a) The Buyer shall, at Buyer's expense remove all thermal insulation, sprayed-on surfacing material, and/or Presumed Asbestos Containing Material (any or all of the foregoing hereinafter "PACAT"), and ACM which may be disturbed during or removal of which is required for the performance of the Services; and,
- (b) The Buyer shall ensure that any areas where any activities involving the abatement or removal of PACM or ACM shall be conspicuously identified, posted and isolated, all as required by applicable law.

BUYER EXPRESSLY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT, IN PERFORMING THE SERVICES AND DISPATCHING EMPLOYEES TO WORK AREAS, SIEMENS IS RELYING UPON THE AGREEMENTS, WARRANTIES, AND REPRESSINTATIONS MADE BY BUYER IN THIS ARTICLE 24. Wilhout limiting its other rights and remedies, Slemens (i) shall not be obligated to commence, and may stop any affected Services, unless and until it is fully satisfied that the Buyer is in compliance with this Article 24, and (ii) shall be entitled to an equitable edjustment in the schedule, price and other provisions of the Agreement resulting from Buyer's non-compliance.

- (3) In no event shall Siemens be obligated to install, disturb, handle, or remove any PACM.
- (4) Siemens makes no representation that it is licensed to abate ACM.
- (5) Euyer shall defend, indemnify and hold Stemens harmless against any and all claims, domands, damages, losses, liabilities, fines, penalties, costs or expenses, including without limitation any clean up or remedial measures arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the Euyer's failure to comply with the provisions of this Article 24.

#### 25. THIRD PARTY PARTS

Buyer warrants that any and all Third Party Parts which may be the subject of any Services shall (a) be fully compatible with the corresponding part, component, equipment or material of the Original Equipment Manufacturer ("OEM") in terms of form, fit, and function: (b) shall be timely provided to Siemens hereunder; and (c) shall be called of installation in the same manner and within the same time as the corresponding OEM part, component, equipment, or material.

### SIEMENS STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS Standard Terms Addendum for Fire and Life Safety

The terms and conditions of this Addendum for Fire and Life Safety ("FLS") are applicable only to the Fire and Life Safety Services identified in the Proposal and supplements the Standard Terms and Conditions with the following four (4) paragraphs (the terms "Work" and "Service" are used interchangeably to reference what Siemens is providing to the Buyer as detailed in the Proposal):

FLS 1. If the FLS Equipment that is to be serviced under this Agreement fails to comply with all applicable codes or if removal of any item of Equipment from coverage would comprends or impair the integrity or the compliance with law applicable to such FLS Equipment, and the Buyer fails to take all necessary corrective action to active compliance, then Stemens may terminate this Agreement without further obligation and retain all moreles received pursuant to this

FLS 2. To the extent that Work on a Fire and Life Safety ("FLS") system is included, the entire FLS system will be tested and inspected as set forth in the National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") guidelines 72 2013 edition (or most current edition). Chapter 14, (hereby incorporated by reference), or as otherwise may be required pursuant to the law of the applicable jurisdiction. All testing of any FLS system will be performed at the time and place and in the manner deemed appropriate by Siemens, in accordance with applicable law and the requirements of NFPA and other relevant standards. - (d) Warranty Notice. Buyer must provide written notice of any claims for breach of Warranty within the applicable Warranty Period. Additionally, absent written notice within the Warranty Period, any use of the Equipment after expiration of the Warranty Period is conclusive evidence that the Warranties have been satisfied.
- (e) Remedies. Buyer's sole and exclusive remedies for breach of the Warranties are limited, at Siemens' discretion, to re-performance of the non-conforming portion of the Services, within a reasonable time period, or refund of all or part of the purchase price. The warranty on re-performed Services is limited to the remainder of the original Warranty Period. Unless Stemens agrees otherwise in writing, Buyer will be responsible for any costs associated with: (i) transportation to and from the Siemens factory or repair tecility; and (ii) damage to Equipment components or parts resulting in whole or in part from non-compliance by the Buyer with Article 8(b) or from their deletionated condition.
- (f) THE WARRANTIES IN THIS ARTICLE 8 ARE SIEMENS' SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE WARRANTIES AND ARE SUBJECT TO THE LIMITS OF LIABILITY IN ARTICLE 9 BELOW. SIEMENS MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, COURSE OF DEALING AND USAGE OF TRADE.
- 9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING IN THIS AGREEMENT TO THE CONTRARY, SIEMENS IS NOT LIABLE, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, WARRANTY, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), STRICT LIABILITY, INDEMNITY OR ANY OTHER LEGAL OR EQUITABLE THEORY, FOR: LOSS OF USES, REVENLE, SAVINAS, PROFIT, INTEREST, GOODWILL OR OPPORTUNITY, LOSS OF PRODUCTION, COSTS OF CAPITAL, COSTS OF REPLACEMENT OR SUBSTITUTE USE OR PERFORMANCE, LOSS OF INFORMATION AND DATA, LOSS OF POWER VOLTAGE IRREGULARITIES OR FREQUENCY FLUCTUATION, CLAIMS ASSISTING FROM BUYER'S THIRD PARTY CONTRACTS, OR FOR ANY TYPE OF INDIRECT, SPECIAL, LIQUIDATED, PUNITIVE, EXEMPLARY, COLLATERAL, INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OR FOR ANY OTHER LOSS OR COST OF A SIMILAR TYPE.

SIEMENS' MAXIMUM LIABILITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT UNDER ANY THEORY OF RECOVERY, WHETHER BASED IN CONTRACT, IN TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE AND STRICT LIABILITY), UNDER WARRANTY, INDEMNITY OR OTHERWISE, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE TOTAL PRICE PAID TO SIEMENS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.

BUYER AGREES THAT THE EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS IN THIS ARTICLE 9 WILL PREVAIL OVER ANY CONFLICTING TERMS AND CONDITIONS IN THIS AGREEMENT AND MUST BE GIVEN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT WHETHER OR NOT ANY OR ALL SUCH REMEDIES ARE DETERMINED TO HAVE FAILED OF THEIR ESSENTIAL PURPOSE. THESE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY ARE EFFECTIVE EVEN IF SIEMENS HAS BEEN ADVISED BY BUYER OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. THE WAIVERS AND DISCLAIMERS OF LIABILITY, RELEASES FROM LIABILITY AND LIMITATIONS ON LIABILITY EXPRESSED IN THIS ARTICLE 9 EXTEND TO SIEMENS. AFFILIATES, PRINCIPALS, SHAREHOLDERS, DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, SUBCONTRACTORS, AGENTS AND SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS OF SIEMENS.

FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBT, IN THE EVENT THAT PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE TO THE BUYER'S PROPERTY RESULTS FROM THE FAILURE OF A PORTION OF THE SERVICES TO CONFORM TO ITS RESPECTIVE WARRANTY DURING THE APPLICABLE WARRANTY FERIOD SIEMENS TO LORDITY SHALL IN NO CASE EXCEED SIEMENS OBLIGATION TO PERFORM THE REMEDIES SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE 0, AS APPLICABLE, WHICH SIEMENS WOULD HAVE HAD TO PERFORM IF SUCH REMEDY HAD BEEN CARRIED OUT IMMEDIATELY PRICH TO THE COCCURRENCE OF THE PHYSICAL LOSS OR DAMAGE.

### 10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.

Siemens will, at its own option and expense, defend or settle any sulf or proceeding brought against Buyer based on an allegation that any processes performed by Stemens in connection with the Services constitutes an infringement of any Patent Cooperation Treaty (PGCT) country member's patent or misappropriation of a third party's trade secret or oppright in the occurry where the Buyer's Site is located. Buyer will promptly give Stemens written notice of the all or proceeding and the authority, information, and assistance needed to defend the claims. Stemens shall have full and exclusive authority to defend and settle such claim and will pay the damages and costs awarded against Stemens in any suit or proceeding so defended in Stemens and shall not enter into a settlement without Stemens and shall not enter into a settlement without Stemens and shall not enter into a settlement without Stemens for proceeding so defended in held to constitute infringement or its use by Buyer is enjoined, Stemens will, at its option and expense, either: (i) procure for Buyer the right to continue using said process; (ii) replace it with substantially equivalent non-intringing process; or (iii) modify the process so it is use is non-intringing.

Siemens will have no duty or obligation under this Article 10 if the process is: (i) performed according to Buyer's design or instructions and compliance therewith has caused Siemens to deviate from its normal course of performance; (ii) modified by Buyer or its contractors with devices, performance; (iii) combined by Buyer or its contractors with devices, performance; (iii) contractors and therefore and by reason of said design, instruction, modification, or combination a suit is brought against Buyer. THIS ARTICLE 10 IS AN EXCLUSIVE STATEMENT OF SIEMENS' DUTIES AND BUYER'S REMEDIES RELATING TO PATENTS, TRADE SECRETS AND COPYRIGHTS, AND DIRECT OR CONTRIBUTORY INFRINGEMENT THEREOF.

#### 11. CONFIDENTIALITY.

However, Siemens has the right to share confidential information with its affitiate and subcontractors provided these recipients are subject to the same confidential information with its affitiate.

(b) Nothing In this Agreement requires a party to treat as confidential any information which: (i) is or becomes generally known to the public, without the fault of the receiving party; (ii) is disclosed to the receiving party, without obligation of

confidentiality, by a third pany having the right to make such disclosure; (ii) was previously known to the receiving party, without obligation of confidentiality, which fact can be demonstrated by means of documents which are in the possession of the receiving party upon the date of this Agreement; or (iv) was independently developed by receiving party its representatives, as oridenced by written records, without the use of discloser's confidential information, or (iv) is required to be disclosed by least, except to the extent oligible for special treatment under an appropriate protective order, provided that the pany required to disclose by law will premptly advise the originating party of any requirement to make such declosure to allow the originating party the opportunity to obtain a protective order and assist the originating party in so chinc.

(c) It is Siemers' policy not to unleastuity or improperty receive or use confidential information, including trade secrets, belonging to others. This policy precludes Siemens from obtaining, directly or indirectly from any employee, contractor, or other individual rendering services to Siemens confidential information of a prior employer, client or any other pressure any other parameters, or individual is under an obligation not to disclose. Buyer agrees to abide by this policy.

(d) Siemens shall retain all intellectual property rights in the Services, works, Siemens' documents, processes, Siemens' confidential information, and any design information and/or documents made by (or on behalf of) Siemens. Upon receipt of all focs, expenses and taxes due in respect of the relevant Services, Siemens grants to the Buyer a non-transferable, non-oxidative, rightly-free floores to toopy, use and communicate Siemens' documents for the sole purpose of operation and maintenance of the facility upon which the Services have been performed.

- COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. The parties agree to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.
- 13. CHANGES IN SERVICES. No change will be made to the scope of Services unless Buyer and Stemens agree in writing to the change and any resulting price, schedule or other contractual modifications. If any change to any law, rule, regulation, order, code, standard or requirement impocts Stemens' obligations or performance under this Agreement, Stemens shall be antitled to a change order for an equilable adjustment in the price and time of performance.
- 14. NON-WAIVER. Any waiver by a party of strict compliance with this Agreement must be in writing, and any failure by the parties to require strict compliance in one instance will not waive its right to insist on strict compliance thereafter.
- 15. MODIFICATION OF TERMS. These terms may only be modified by a written instrument signed by authorized
- 15. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party may assign all or part of this Agreement, or any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other, but either party may assign its rights and obligations, without recourse or consent to, any perent, wholly wined subsidiary or artificate or difficient excessor organization (whether as a result of reorganization, restructuring or sale of substantially all of a party's assets). However, Buyer shall not assign this Agreement to a competitor of Siemans, an entity in litigation with Semans, or an entity hadding the financial capability to salisfy Buyer's obligations. Any assignce expressly assumes the performance of any obligation assigned. Siemens may grant a security interest in this Agreement and/or assign proceeds of this Agreement without Buyer's consent.
- 17. APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION. This Agreement is are governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware, without repard to its conflict of laws principles. The application of the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods is excluded. BOTH SEMENS AND BUYER KNOWNGLY, VOLLINTARILY AND IRREVOCABLY WANYE ALL RIGHTS TO A JURY TRIAL IN ANY ACTION OR PROCEEDING FELATED IN ANY WAY TO THIS AGREEMENT. Each party agrees that claims and deputes arising out of this Agreement must be decided actualisty in a federal or state court of competent jurisdiction located in a state in which either Buyer or Stemens maintains its principal place of businesse. Each party submitts to the personal jurisdiction of such courts for the aureous of Einstein any claiming or districts.
- 18. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired. A court may modify the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision to reflect, as closely as possible, the parties' original intent.
- 19. EXPORTABIPORT COMPLIANCE. Buyer admonstrates that Stemens is required to compty with applicable export/import laws and regulations rotating to the sals, export, import, transfer, seeignment, disposal and use of goods or information provided in the performance of the Services, including any export/import license requirements. Buyer agroes that such goods or information shell not at any time directly or infrared be used, exported, imported, cold, bransford and cherwise disposed of in a manner which will result in non-compliance with any caport/import laws and regulations Stemend continuing performance hareancher is conditioned on compliance with such export/import laws and regulations at all times.

 NUCLEAR. In the event the Services provided under the Agreement are to be performed at or in any manner in connection with a nuclear installation, the following conditions shall apply:

#### A. Buyer's Insurance

(1) If Buyer procures property damage insurance applicable to occurrences at the Site and third party non-nuclear liability insurance, or either of such types of insurance, such insurance will name. Stemens and its subcontractors as additional insureds.

(2) Buyer shall have at its own cost, prior to the arrival of nuclear fuel at the Site, secured and shall thereafter maintain in force protection against liability arising out of or resulting from a Nuclear Incident (as defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended) as required by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission; provided, however, that if the nuclear fability protection system in effect on the date of the Agreement express or is repealed, changed, or modified, Buyer will, without cost to Siemers, maintain liability protection through government indemnity, limitation of liability and/or liability insurance witch will not result in a material impairment of the protection afford Siemers and its subcontractors by such nuclear liability protection system which is in effect as of the date of the Agreement, taking into account the availability of insurance, customary practice in the industry for plants of similar size and character, and other relevant factors in light of them existing conditions, in any overst, the protection provided pursuant to this Article shall remain in effect until the decommissioning of the nuclear plant.

B. Waivers by Buyer: Neither Siemens, nor its subcontractors shall be liable for any loss of, damage to, or loss of use of property or equipment wherever located, arising out of or resulting from a "Nuclear Incident." Buyer waives and will require its insurers to waive all rights of recovery against Siemens and its subcontractors on account of any such loss, damage, or loss of use. All such waivers shall be full and unrestricted and in a form acceptable to Siemers.

In the event Buyer recovers damages from a third party based on losses at the Site resulting from the hazardous properties of source, apacial nuclear or byproduct material (as defined in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended), Buyer shall defend, indemnify and hold Siemens and its subcontractors harmless against daims by such third party which are based on Buyer's recovery of such damages. In addition, Buyer wildvos and will require its instructors to waive all rights of recovery against Siemens and its subcontractors, for any and all docts or expenses origing out of or in connection with the investigation and settlement of daims or the defense of suits for damage resulting from the nuclear energy hazard.

- C. Third Party Property Protection: Euyer will indemnify and hold Siemens and its subcontractors hermless for any liability arising out of loss of or damage to property at the Site which arises out of a Nuclear Incident. In addition, Buyer shall obtain for the benefit of Siemens and its subcontractors, protection against fability for, arising out of, or resulting rorn damage to any property or equipment located at the Site which is used or intended for use by Beyer in connection with the operation of the nuclear power plant (including but not limited to fuel) and which is cannot by parties other than Buyer.
- D. Decentamination: Buyer shall, without cost to Siemens, perform any required decontamination and health physics necessary for, related to or resulting from Siemens performance of its contractual obligations. This includes but is not limited to decontamination of any Siemens equipment or tools used in the performance thereof. Buyer shall provide documentation demonstrating that components or parts being returned to Siemens after such decontamination meet the requirements designated for unrestricted release as set forth in the United States Code of Federal Regulations, Titlo 10.
- SURVIVAL The Articles entitled Interfectual Property, "Limitation of Liability," Indemnity, "Confidentiality," "Risk of Loss and Schedule," "Export/Import Compliance," and "Nuclear" survive any termination, expiration or cancellation of this Agreement.
- 22. SITE SAFETY, Eujer shall comply with all federal, state, and local safety regulations and standards applicable to the Site and to the Equipment on which Stemens will perform the Services. Stemens shall not be obligated to commence or perform Services under the Services shall be applicable safety requirements. In the event Buyer's Site safety is non-compliant, Stemens may suspend the Services until such time as Buyer corrects the non-compliance. To the extent Stemens incurs additional time and experse as the result of Buyer's non-compliance, Stemens shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment in the schedule, price and other affected provisions of the Agreement.
- 23. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE. To the extent that the performance of Services at the Site may involve the generation of hazardous waste as such term is defined in the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. 6901, et e.e.), the laws of the state in which the Site is located and the rules or regulations issued therounder as are now in effect or hereafter amended from time to time (such generated hazardous waste being herein referred to as "Hazardous Waste") stall apply.

Buyer shall at its expense and in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances (i) furths Siemens with containers for Hazardous Waste, (ii) designate a storage area at the Side preximate to the Services where such containers are to be placed; and (iii) handle, store and dispose of Hazardous Waste. Buyer shall reimburse Siemens for additional costs, if any, incurred in complying with any such laws, regulations, rules and/or ordinances.

Siemens shall have no responsibility or liability with regard to any Hazardous Waste which it does not know or have reason to know will be generated or released in the performance of the Services, and Styler shall indemnify and hold Siemens harmless for all damages, locaces, costs, (bibilities, fince and penaltice, (including reasonable attempts feet) related to pollution and environmental impairment arising from the Buyer's property, the Equipment or the Services.

### 24. ASBESTOS

The terms "Asbestos" and "Presumed Asbestos Containing Material" shall have the meanings set forth in United States Code of Fedoral Regulations Chapter 29 Section CFR 1925.1101 et seq., and "ACM" shall mean Asbestos and Asbestos containing materials.

- (1) The Buyer warrants and represents that, in any areas which may be accessed by Sigmens or its Supplions, any ACM which is or is contained in thermal insulation or sprayed-on surfacing material is conspicuously and specifically marked as ACM, and any other ACM is in a lawful condition.
- (2) Prior to Siemens' commencement of Services at any Site:
- (a) The Buyer shall, at Buyer's expense remove all thermal insulation, sprayed-on surfacing material, and/or Presumed Asbestos Containing Material (any or all of the foregoing hereinafter "PACM"), and ACM which may be disturbed during or removal of which is required for the performance of the Services; and,

(b) The Buyer shall ensure that any areas where any activities involving the abatement or removal of PACM or ACM shall be conspicuously identified, posted and isolated, all as required by applicable law.

BUYER EXPRESSLY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT, IN PERFORMING THE SERVICES AND DISPATCHING EMPLOYEES TO WORK AREAS, SIEMENS IS RELYING UPON THE AGREEMENTS, WARRANTIES, AND REPRESENTATIONS MADE BY BUYER IN THIS ARTICLE 24. Without limiting its other rights and remodies, Samens (i) shall not be obligated to commence, and may stop any affected Services, unless and until it is fully satisfied that the Buyer is in compliance with this Article 24, and (iii) shall be entitled to an equitable adjustment in the schedule, price and other provisions of the Agreement resulting from Buyer's non-compliance.

- In no event shall Slemens be obligated to install, disturb, handle, or remove any PACM.
- Siemens makes no representation that it is licensed to abate ACM.
- (5) Buyer shall defend, indemnify and hold Siemens harmless against any and all claims, demands, damage losses, liabilities, fines, penalties, costs or expenses, including without limitation any dean up or remedial measure arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the Buyer's failure to comply with the provisions of this Antide 24.

#### 25. THIRD PARTY PARTS

Buyer warrants that any and all Third Party Parts which may be the subject of any Services shall (a) be fully compatible with the corresponding part, component, equipment or material of the Originel Equipment Manufacturer (\*OEM\*\*) in terms of form, fit, and function; (b) shall be timely provided to Siemens hereunder, and (o) shall be capable of installation in the same marrier and within the same time as the corresponding OEM part, component, or material.

## SIEMENS STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS Standard Terms Addendum for Fire and Life Safe

The terms and conditions of this Addendum for Fire and Life Safety ("FLS") are applicable only to the Fire and Life Safety Services identified in the Proposal and supplements the Standard Terms and Conditions with the following four (4) paragraphs (the terms "Work" and "Service" are used interchangeably to reference what Siemens is providing to the Buyer as detailed in the Proposal):

FLS 1. If the FLS Equipment that is to be serviced under this Agreement late to comply with all applicable codes or if removal of any item of Equipment from coverage would comprenise or impair the integrity or the compliance with law applicable to such FLS Equipment, and the Buyer fails to take all necessary corrective action to exhieve compliance, then Stemans may terminate this Agreement without further chiligation and retain all montes received pursuant to this

FLS 2. To the extent that Work on a Fire and Life Safety ("FLS") system is included, the entire FLS system will be tested The Country of the extern that work on a time and Life Stafety (FLST) system is included, the entire FLS system will be tessed and inspected as set forth in the National Fine Protection Association ("NFFAT) guidelines 72 2014 edition (or most current adition). Chapter 14, (hereby incorporated by reference), or as otherwise may be required pursuant to the law of the applicable jurisdiction. All testing of any FLS system will be performed at the time and place and in the manner deemed appropriate by Stemens; in accordance with applicable law and the requirements of NFFA and other relevant standards. Buyer will be solely responsible for, and hereby indomnifies and holds Stemens hamiless from and against, any fability sitting from the Buyer's specification of any testing schedule other than in accordance with NFPA guidelines or other applicable standards.

FLS 3. Buyer alone shall act to protect life and properly from the time a partial or full system failure occurs until Stemens notifies Buyer that such system is operational or the emergency has been cleared. Buyer's actions shall include all appropriate interim safety precautions (such as a manual fire watch). Stemens shall have no obligation to provide guerds, fire watch personnel, or other services following a system failure, except Services as are specifically provided for in this Agreement.

FLS 4. The Buyers sole remedy for any and all claims, losses or expenses arising from, or caused by, the failure of a Stemens installed FLS system to operate property shall be limited to the same remedy as the Buyer's sole remedy for a defective nonconforming FLS system provided hereunder which shall be in accordance with the warranty terms contained in this Agreement.

## SIEMENS STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS Standard Terms Addendum for Monitoring Services

The terms and conditions of this Addendum for Monitoring Services are applicable only to the Monitoring Services identified in the Proposal ("MS") and supplements and modifies the Standard Terms and Conditions with the following additional Articles:

- 1.1 "Monitoring Services" means that portion, if eny, of the Services expressly described as Monitoring and/or Notification Services and relating to offsite Central Station Monitoring ("CMS") or Buyer Support Center ("CSC") services expressly agreed to be provided by Siemens to Buyer.
- "Monitored Site" means the Buyer site for which Monitoring Services are to be provided.

### MS Article 2: Alarm Monitoring and/or Notification Service

Stemens may provide atarm monitoring and/or notification services to Buyer under this Agreement. Buyer advowledges and agrees that in the event an atarm is received at Stemens' monitoring center, Stemens will attempt to centest Buyer or any representative provided to Stemens on Buyer's Emergency contact list by telephone! two-way voice to confirm the atarm is not false. In the event Stemens falls to contact Buyer or its representative, Stemens will attempt to notify the police department or fire department. Buyer agrees that Stemens shall have no liability portaining to any two way voice communications, text messaging or internet vidos recordings or their publications. Stemens shall not be table for any damages or atarm signal failures due to communication disruptions to telephone lines, cell phones, internet connections, radio frequency, Internet, any other transmission modes, including but not finited to DSL, Cable, ADSL, VOIP. Stemens shall have no responsibility or liability for interruptions of service or any resulting co-resequence.

### MS Article 3: Signal Response

Sismens' response to receipt of signals from the alarm system and signaling initiation devices (collectively, "System") shall be in accordance with Siemers' Standard Operating Procedures and with this Agreement. Siemens responses the right, in sole judgment, to first investigate the cause of such signals by either telephoning Buyer at Buyer's designated telephone number(s), or dispatching a representative to Buyer's premises to determine whether an emergency condition exists, warranting transmission of the signal(s) to the Potes ("security manitoring"). Fire Department ("fire manitoring"), and/or Buyer's designated representative ("mechanical manitoring").

#### MS Article 4: Requirements of Buyer

- 4.1 The following are additional requirements of Euyer.
  4.1.1 Furnish Siemens with a written list of names, titles, and contact phone numbers of all persons authorized to enter the Monitored Ste after business hours and provide Siemens with written updates of any charge prior to close of business at the Monitored Ste on the day of such change;
  4.1.2 Furnish Siemens with a written list of names, titles, and contact phone numbers of persons to be notified in the event a System signal is received and provide Siemens with written updates of any change prior to close of business at the Monitored Ste on the day of such change;
  4.1.3 Furnish Siemens written notice of any changes in the System or any applicable bureau or authority having institution for same:

- 4.1.3 Furnish Samers which nouse or any searches which states are stated and search in a s adequate sensitivity is maintained;
  4.1.7 Turn off or remove from the Monitored Site anything which does or may interfere with the effectiveness of
- 4.1.8 Furnish telephone or network service connecting the Monitored Site to Siemens monitoring facilities.
- 4.2 Buyer understands that calls made to Siemens in connection with signals or access to the Monitored Site may be recorded by Siemens. Buyer, for itself, its agents, and employees consents to such recording.
- 4.3 Buyer shall use reasonable efforts to prevent false alarms. In the event of a-false alarm (not caused by the regisjonce or willful misconduct of Siemens), Buyer shall remain liable for taxes, lees or other charges of any police or fire department, or any other governmental body. Buyer agrees to pay Siemens to reprogram the system if necessary to comply with any area code, telephone numbering or other charges Buyer shall directly pay or, to the extent paid by Siemens, numbures Siemens, for any false alarm fine, pecalty or fee assessed against Siemens by any governmental or municipal agency as a result of such fields alarms and, in addition, pay a processing fee of ten percent of each invoice that Siemens submits to the Buyer for such talse alarms.

- 5.1 Siemens resorves the right to terminate the Monitoring Services at any time after seven (7) days written notice, upon the happening of any of the following: (a) Buyer does not follow proper operation or maintenance procedures or does not use the System property; (b) Buyer falls to comply with any of the terms of this Agreement. In addition, Siemens shall have the right to terminate the Monitoring Services Immediately if: (a) Stemens is unable either to secure or to rotain the wind connections or privileges necessary for the transmission of signals between the Monitored Site, Siemens monitoring inacitly and the numerical first or police department; or (b) the monitoring facility, continuing services within Siemens' premises are destroyed by fire or other catastrophe, or so substantially demaged that it is impractical to continue service. The Monitoring Services may be terminated immediately by Buyer if the Monitoring Services or obtained as the temasable for its pre-demage use provided that it plays any unpaid balance of the charges accrued hereunder for Services randered prior to the effective date of termination.
- 5.2 In the event of termination of the Monitoring Services for any reason, Buyer authorizes Siemons to make the necessary arrangements with the telephone company to disconnect the telephone service between the Monitored Site and the monitoring facility and to remove any mode of communication and/or communication interface devices, such as moderns, delara, digital communications, which are and remain the property of Siemens.

### MS Article 6: Insurance/Authorization to Notify Authorities/Liquidated Damages/Indemnity

- 6.1 Insurance, if any, covering personal injury and property loss or damage on any of Buyer's premises shall be obtained by Buyer. Buyer agrees to proceed exclusively against Buyer's insurer to recover any damages.
- 6.2 If applicable, Buyer hereby authorizes and directs Siemens, as its agent, to direct the local police department having jurisdiction, to detain and cause the arrest of every person found in and about the Monitored Site without authorization as evidenced by the list of authorized persons provided by Buyer and to hold every such person until released by a representative of Buyer designated for this purpose; in all such cases the Buyer agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Stemans and its employees or agents harmless against all liability, costs, damages or expense in consequence of such arrest and detention.
- 6.3 From the nature of the Mentening Services, it is impractical and extremely difficult to fix the actual damages, if any, which may proximately result from the failure of Siemens to perform any of its obligations hereunder, or the failure of the System to properly operate. If Siemens is found table for less or damage due to a failure on the part of Siemens, in any respect, its fability related to Mentioring Services shall be limited in the aggregate for the term of fix Agreement to the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2500.00) Delians as fleuidated damages. Such limit of liability is not a penalty and this limited liability star to be complete and exclusive. The provisions of this paragraph shall apply in the event less damage, inespective of cause or origin, results directly or indirectly from the performance or nonperformance of the obligations so first by this Agreement or from negligence, active or otherwise, of Semens its agents or amployees. The parties acknowledge that the price which Semens has agreed to perform the Mentening Services and obligations is calculated based upon the foregoing limitations of liability, and that Siemens has expressly relied on, and would not have entered into this Agreement but for such limitations of liability.
- 6.4 Buyer is solely responsible for the life and safety of all persons in the Monitored Site, and for protecting against losses to its own property or the property of others in the Monitored Site. Buyer agrees to indennify, defend and hold harmloss Siemens from any and all such claims and lawsals including the payment of all damages, expenses, costs, and atternay fees incured by Siemens, its employees and agents, from and against all claims, whealth was the substance of the System. Siemens acquipment or Monitoring Services in any respect, whether due or allegand to be due to malfunction or non-function of the System. Samens does not represent or warrant that the Services will not be compromised, interrupted or circumvented; that the Services will prevent any loss from any cause; or that the Services will not access provide the protection for which it is performed, installed or intended (collectively "Protections"). Byer actorowicety and agrees that it assumes all risk class or damage to its facilities and sites including the contents thereon, and that Siemers has neither made representations for warrantias, nor has Buyer relied on any representation or warrantias, express or implied regarding said Protections.

### Hummel and Plum Donation Agreement - Athletic Sponsorship

This Donation Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Circleville City School District Board of Education ("the District") and Hummel and Plum Insurance Agency ("Donor"). The terms of this Agreement are as follows:

- I Term The Term of this Agreement shall be for a period of 25 years. The Term shall begin to run the first day on which the District displays Donor's name on the component/ location Donor has agreed to sponsor. Any failure by Donor to utilize any Additional Amenities available to it under this Agreement shall not operate to extend or suspend the Term of this Agreement in any way.
- IL Component/Location Name: During the Term of this Agreement, District agrees to place donor signs in the following component/location:

### Baseball Complex

for a period of twenty-five (25) years.

Donor's rights under this Agreement shall not be transferred or assigned to another individual or entity without the prior written consent of the District.

Donor represents and warrants to the District, as of the date this Agreement is entered into, that it is the owner of any name, logo, trademark or other materials it wishes to display on the District's property pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

- III. Additional Amenities: Donor shall also be entitled to receive the following amenities during the term of this Agreement:
  - A. Advertisements: During the Term of this Agreement, Donor shall:
    - Have the opportunity to place one (1) full page advertisement in the District's yearbook during each year that the yearbook is published;
    - (2) Have the opportunity to place one (1) full page advertisement in each District program prepared for athletic teams of the District during each year that a program is published.
    - (3) Have the opportunity to place three (3) signs at the baseball complex.
    - (4) Receive recognition on the District's website.

Any content or messaging a Donor wishes to place in an advertisement and/or sign must be submitted to the District by July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. All advertisements and signs must be pre-approved by the District prior to placement. In the event a Donor's advertisement and/or sign is not approved by the District, the Donor shall be notified of the District's decision. The Donor shall then have up to fifteen (15) business days to provide the District with alternative content for the advertisement and/or sign it wishes to place. If the Donor fails to provide the District with alternative content for the advertisement and/or sign it wishes to place within fifteen (15) business days, Donor forfeits its right to place an advertisement and/or sign for the school year.

- B. Athletic Tickets: During the Term of this Agreement, Donor shall receive 4 (four) season passes to all home athletic contests.
- IV. Fee: In consideration of the benefits provided pursuant to this Agreement, Donor agrees to pay the District a sum of \$25,000 (Twenty-five thousand dollars).

Within fifteen (15) business days of the date on which the last signature appears on this agreement, the Donor shall receive "website recognition." The District shall have no further obligation to Donor, including any additional obligations set forth under Sections II and III above until Donor has paid the District a total of \$25,000 (Twenty-five thousand dollars).

V. Consideration: Donor acknowledges and agrees that its acceptance of either the rights afforded it with respect to the Component/Signage Location and/or any Additional Amenity set forth in this Agreement represents sufficient consideration for payment of the Fee set forth in this Agreement.

Donor further agrees that upon acceptance of either the rights afforded it with respect to the Component Location Name and/or any Additional Amenity set forth in this Agreement for any period of time, it would be unjustly enriched by receiving a refund of any portion of the Fee paid to the District.

- VI. Cessation of Athletic/Academic Activities: In the event that the District cancels, suspends, or otherwise ceases to offer any athletic and/or academic activity to which this Agreement applies, any remaining obligations existing under this Agreement shall immediately terminate. Donor acknowledges and agrees that it shall not be entitled to a refund of any portion of its donation as a result of any cessation of a sponsored athletic and/or academic activity to which this Agreement applies.
- VII. Likeness: Donor acknowledges and agrees that the rights granted pursuant to this Agreement do not include the right to use the name or likeness of the District, its employees, and/or students in connection with any promotion of Donor or its services.
- VIII. Force Majeure: If the Component/Location is damaged by fire, earthquake, act of God, the elements or other casualty or is otherwise rendered unusable for its intended purpose at any time during the Term of this Agreement, any remaining obligation of either party under this Agreement shall be suspended until such time as the Component/Location may be repaired. In the event the Component/Location cannot be repaired, any remaining obligations under this Agreement shall terminate. In the event new signage is needed, or requested by either party, the rendering and cost of such new signage will be shared equally.

In the event the District decides, in its sole discretion, to rebuild the Component/Location following a fire, earthquake, act of God, the elements or other casualty or as a result of it being rendered unusable for its intended purpose, any remaining Term of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect beginning on the date on which the new Component/Location is complete.

Neither party shall be liable or responsible for any failure to perform its obligations hereunder, which failure is caused or brought about in any manner beyond the control of such party, including but not limited to strikes, federal, state, or local government action or inaction, or any other act or condition beyond its reasonable control, other than such party's inability to perform payment obligations.

- D. Indemnity: Donor agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the District harmless from any and all claims, costs, expenses, damages and litigation, including attorney's fees, resulting from any copyright, trademark or similar claims during the Term of this Agreement. Upon the termination of this Agreement for any
  - reason, this section shall survive with respect to any claims, costs, expenses, damages and litigation, including attorney's fees, resulting from any copyright, trademark or similar claims that arose during the term of this Agreement.
- X. Removal of Name/Cancellation of Agreement: During the term of this Agreement, should Donor take any action, that in the reasonable opinion of the District, brings dishonor and/or disrepute to the Donor and/or the District, the District may cancel this Agreement at its discretion. Donor acknowledges and agrees that it shall not be entitled to a refund of any portion of its donation in the event this Agreement is terminated pursuant to this section.
- XI. Assignment: As set forth in Section II, Donor's rights under this Agreement shall be not be transferred or assigned to another individual or entity without the prior written consent of the District.
- XII. Governing Law: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio.
- XIII. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and shall become a binding and enforceable Agreement among the parties hereto. No prior verbal or written agreement shall survive the execution of this Agreement. Any alteration or modification to this Agreement shall be set forth in writing and shall be signed by both parties.

# AGREEMENT FOR NATIONAL WEBCHECK® PROGRAM SERVICES AND EQUIPMENT

This Agreement ("Agreement") between the Ohio Attorney General ("Attorney General"), which oversees the Bureau of Criminal Investigation ("BCI"), and ("Agency") is effective on the latest date of signature below, and identifies the terms, conditions, duties, and responsibilities of each party regarding the National WebCheck® ("WebCheck") program and equipment. The Agreement also ensures that the information received from the Attorney General is used appropriately by Agency and within the requirements of the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Administrative Code, and Federal laws and regulations.

#### I. Purpose

Under Ohio law, persons in various occupations and volunteer roles must obtain criminal background checks in order to be eligible for licensing, employment and volunteer activities. Such criminal background checks are available through the WebCheck services administered by the Attorney General, through BCI. This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions under which Agency may obtain and disseminate criminal background check information through WebCheck services.

#### II. Basic Agency Responsibilities

- A. Agency must procure WebCheck equipment from a vendor that has been certified by BCI as an approved provider and maintain the equipment as directed by the vendor.
- B. Agency agrees to comply with any and all monitoring requests made by the Attorney General in a timely and complete manner.
- C. Agency agrees to comply with any and all training requirements set forth by the Attorney General. Agency's participation in an initial training will be required before Agency will be granted access to the WebCheck services.

### III. Agency Responsible for Full and Timely Payment of Fees to Be Charged by Attorney General

A. To ensure full and prompt payment, Agency agrees to make fee payments to the Attorney General using commercially reasonable payment methods as directed by the Attorney General. Such methods may include, without limitation, payments via Automated Clearing House ("ACH") or other electronic payment method. Notice of any changes in the required payment methods shall be provided pursuant to Section XI.

> PICKAWAY COUNTY PATHWAYS FOR SUCCESS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

#### PURPOSE OF SCHOOL

Three Pickaway County school districts (Circleville City School District, Logan Elm School District and Westfall School District) have entered into an agreement approved by the Ohio Department of Education to provide an alternative educational environment for designated students. The purpose of the school is to ensure a structured learning setting that will enable the students to achieve academic success.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The school districts believe that the assignment of a Pickaway County Juvenile Court Probation officer (hereinafter referred to as "JPO") to the school will facilitate the success of students who are on probation with the court. Not all, but some of the designated students are on Community Control (Probation) with the Pickaway County Juvenile Court. The Pickaway County Juvenile Court has agreed to assign a JPO to remain on site at the facility during school operation hours to assist in the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding.

#### **EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF JUVENILE COURT PROBATION OFFICER**

The Pickaway County Juvenile Court JPO is an employee of the Pickaway County Juvenile Court under the control and supervision of the Pickaway County Juvenile Judge. The Pickaway County Juvenile Court shall be solely responsible for the compensation of the JPO. The Pickaway County Juvenile Judge retains discretion and does have the authority to summon the JPO to the Juvenile Court to assist with other probation related functions.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF JUVENILE COURT PROBATION OFFICER

The JPO has specific powers as authorized by section 2151.14 of the Revised Code which directs a Probation Officer to exercise control over youth who are placed on Community Control by the court. The JPO does not have authority to exercise control over any youth at the school that is not on probation with the court. In that regard, the JPO is neither a School Resource Officer nor a law enforcement officer. The JPO does not have arrest authority or any other control over juveniles who are not on probation with the court.

The JPO may transport the juveniles on probation to and from the school facility.

The JPO is not responsible for performing neither any duties relative to the education of the probationer nor any other student at the school.

If the school officials agree and there is no interference with the education of a youth on probation at the school, the JPO may meet with and work with said youth to fulfill terms of probation, including but not limited to performing community work service.

The JPO shall meet with the Juvenile Judge on a weekly basis to report on the status of the students on probation. The School officials acknowledge that this meeting will require his absence for a brief period of time to attend such meeting. The JPO shall inform the Director of the School of the meeting dates and times.
